EPA Reviews Cleanup at Havertown PCP Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting a Five-Year Review of the Havertown PCP Superfund Site located in Haverford Township, PA. The previous Five-Year Review, looking at Phases I and II of the cleanup, was completed in August 2005. This next review will assess if **all three phases** of the cleanup are protective of human health and the environment. The first two phases included a geosynthetic cap and a groundwater treatment system. The third phase, which is scheduled to be completed during the spring of 2010, consists of additional groundwater cleanup, soil excavation/backfilling and additional monitoring. This fourth Five-Year Review document will be available in August 2010.

What is a Five-Year Review?

EPA inspects sites every five years to ensure that cleanups remain fully protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews are required by law when contaminants remain at a site. The reviews include:

- Inspection of the site and cleanup technologies
- Review of monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records
- Determination if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.
