

Gest Hall 1853, became part of Founders Hall after 1905 connecting addition built. Venetian windows in this rectangular section. Hexagonal cupola on roof of main facade. In 1988-89 the building was gutted on the interior, but the exterior has been preserved to replicate the original: the shades of stucco were matched to the former shades, and triple-pane windows duplicated the original windows.					
27. history, significance and/or background First building of Haverford College, the first college founded by the Society of Friends in the U.S. (Founders were orthodox Quakers.) The institution was first called "Haverford School." There are several historic structures on the present 225 acres of carefully tended grounds. Founders Hall originally housed the dormitories, classrooms and laboratories; currently functions as administration building.

1st floor: rough finish, uniform laying face laid in random, varying bond; wrap-around porch, modified palladian window under porch and in rounded bay on north elevation (1st & 2nd floors). 2nd Floor: sided in squared-off wood shingles; modified Palladian window in rounded bay (North elevation) paired windows on front facade, projecting two sided bay w/diamond pane 12 lite/1 sash. 1/2 story: projecting gable has fish scale



History, Significance and/or Background Constructed in 1888, addition in 1915, remodelled 1951-52, the hall was named after Thomas Chase, past president of the College. It was originally constructed for science classrooms, but was totally remodelled in 1988-89 for the Dean and Registrar's offices. Chase Hall is part of the Haverford College campus, the first school in the United States founded by the Society of Friends in 1837. The Hall is an example of the growth of the College in the late 19th-early 20th C. which saw numerous campus and residential buildings being erected on the College Grounds.		3. 27. history, significance and/or background <p>Originally constructed in 1864 for the faculty and students of Haverford the library has gone through numerous additions and alterations. The south wing is the 1898 section with the north wing built in 1864. In 1912 an old stack was added, and in 1941 the new stack was added and the old stack converted to the Treasure Room. In 1952 the Phillips Memorial Wing was sensitively incorporated with the two original sections.</p>		(continue on back if necessary)
